MARTYRDOM OF DR ROWLAND TAYLOR (1555)



aylor was born in 1*5*76 in Richmond, Yorkshire, England, where his father was closely associated with anti-Roman Catholic elements, especially the Puritans. A follower of William Perkins, an influential theologian, Taylor began preaching at age 21 and when about 25 years old, he preached a sermon at St Paul's Cross - before Queen Elizabeth. He also held strong anti-Catholic views.

In a sermon delivered at St. Mary's, Cambridge, in 1608, Taylor denounced Archbishop Richard Bancroft's severe attitude towards Puritans. He was then silenced by Samuel Harsnet, Archbishop of York and threatened with degradation.

There began a period of 17 years, in which Taylor had no benefice. However, he had patrons, and is known to have been chaplain to Edward Conway, English soldier and statesman. Taylor lived in Watford in 1612, before moving to Reading where his brother, Theophilus Taylor was the minister of St Lawrence Church from 1618-1640.

At Reading, young preachers gathered round Taylor, among them William Jemmat who later edited his works. Thereafter, Taylor obtained his Doctor of Divinity from Cambridge in 1630. He was later assigned to the church at Hadley, Suffolk as parish priest. Under his leadership, the Gospel of Christ had great success and took such root that many men and women in the parish were knowledgeable about Scriptures. Some could even be found who had often read the entire Bible, could recite some of Paul's epistles by heart, and could give a godly Scriptural reply in any controversy.

Taylor was a mild-mannered person, humble and without pride. None in his parish was so poor that he or she could not approach him as a child to a father, and none was so rich that he could not rebuke him or her when they sinned. His preaching was forceful, firm, and true to the word of God. He thrived in his stewardship throughout the reign of Edward VI. But when Edward died in 1553, his half-sister, Mary succeeded him to the throne of England. The woman later called "Bloody Mary," a Catholic, persecuted true believers of Jesus Christ, killing many of them. Taylor did not escape this papist violence.

In the beginning of this rage of the Antichrist, two of Taylor's parishioners, an attorney named Foster and a tradesman, Clerk, hired John Averth, parson of Aldman and a Catholic, to hold mass at Hadley's parish on the Monday before Easter. They obtained entrance to the church building and secretly built up their altar with all its idolatries. Some faithful parishioners later destroyed the altar. The next day, the group mobilised some armed men and rebuilt the altar where they conducted their mass.

aylor, who was attracted to the noise confronted Averth and said, "Who made you so bold as to enter this church of Christ and profane and defile it with this abominable idolatry?" With that, Foster raged against Taylor and said, "You traitor! What are you doing here disturbing the Queen's proceedings?" Taylor replied, "I am no traitor, but I am the shepherd that God, my Lord Christ has appointed to feed this flock. Therefore I have good authority to be here, and I command you, in the name of God, to get away from this place, and not dare to poison Christ's flock." Then, after another exchange of words, the armed group forced Taylor out the building and continued with their popish mass.

Some days later, Foster and Clerk wrote a letter to Stephen Gardiner, Bishop of Winchester and Lord Chancellor, complaining about Taylor. The Bishop responded by commanding Taylor to appear before him on a certain date. When Taylor's friends heard about this, they were extremely grieved for they knew what the result would be. So they advised him to flee the country. But he said to them,

I most heartily thank you for so tenderly caring for me. And although I know that I can look for neither justice not truth at the hands of my adversaries, I know that my cause is so good and righteous, and the truth so strong on my side, that by God's grace I will go and appear before them and resist to their faces their false doings.

Shortly after, Taylor presented himself to Gardiner. The meeting started on an unpleasant note as the Bishop reviled Taylor, calling him an unprincipled person, a traitor and heretic. Taylor listened patiently and then said, "My lord, I am neither a traitor nor heretic, but a true subject and a faithful Christian man. I have come here as you commanded me, so that I might learn the reason why your lordship sent for me." The Bishop replied, "Have you come, you villain? Have you no shame that you dare to look me in the face? Do you not know who I am?

"Yes," said Taylor, "I know who you are. You are Dr Stephen Gardiner, Bishop of Winchester and lord Chancellor, and yet a mortal man, I think. But if I should be afraid of your lordly looks, why are you not afraid of God, the Lord of us all? How dare you not be ashamed to look any Christian man in the face, seeing you have forsaken the truth, denied our Saviour Christ and His word, and acted contrary to your oath and the things you wrote? How will you look when you appear before the judgment seat of Christ and answer to that oath, that you made first to King Henry the VIII, who is well remembered, and afterward to his son, King Henry the VI?

The Bishop answered, "Tut-tut, that was Herod's oath to Salome: unlawful, and so worthy to be broken. I have done well in breaking it, and I thank God I have come home to our mother the Catholic Church of Rome, and that is what I wish to do."

Taylor answered,

Should I forsake the true Church of Christ, which is founded upon the true foundation of the apostles and prophets, to approve those lies, errors, superstitions, and idolatries that the popes and their company on this day, so blasphemously approve? No. God forbid. Let the pope and his followers return to our Saviour and His word, throw out of the church the abominable idolatries that he maintains, and then Christian men will return to him. You wrote truthfully against him yourself, and were sworn against him.

"I told you," said the Bishop, "it was as Herod's oath, unlawful, and so should be broken and not kept. Our holy father, the pope, has released me from it." Taylor replied, "But you shall not be discharged before Christ, who doubtless will require your oath to be kept, and from whose obedience no man can pardon you, neither the pope nor any of his followers."

After exhausting his energy trying to cow Taylor into submission, the Bishop committed him to Clink Prison from where he was tried by a group of Catholic heretics led by Edmund Bonner, Bishop of London. Thereafter, he was moved to Woolsack, then to Brentwood en route to Hadley. When they entourage came within two miles of Hadley, Taylor asked if he could get off his horse, and when permission was given, he leaped down and danced around in great joy. "Why, master doctor," the Sheriff of Suffolk said, "What are you doing, are you all right?" Taylor answered, "Well, God be praised, good master Sheriff, never better, for now I know I am almost home. I haven't more than a few steps to go over, and I am right at my Father's house."

When they arrived at Hadley, men, women and children turned out in large numbers, crying over the suffering and loss of their faithful shepherd. Addressing the crowd, Taylor said, "I have preached to you God's word and truth, and have come here this day to seal it with my blood." From there, the heretics took Taylor to Aldham Common and burnt at the stake for refusing to deny Christ as his Lord and Saviour. Before they lit the fire, he lifted both hands and said, "Merciful Father of heaven, for Jesus Christ my Savour's sake, receive my soul into Thy hands." Then he stood still in the fire without crying or howling, with his hands folded together before him, until one of the Catholic heretics, Mulleine Soyce struck him on the head with a halberd and split his head open so that his brains fell out and his corpse collapsed into the fire.

I need someone to explain to me how these Catholic heretics were different from the Islamic terrorists of the 21st century. I believe that both groups belong to satan, the founder of all dead religions. Anyone who still embraces the Roman Catholic Church after reading stories like this has a death wish and has chosen to spend eternity in the lake of fire with satan.

WHO SITS ON THE THRONE OF YOUR HEART?



n his book, the Pursuit of God, A. W. Tozer, diagnosed the major problem of modern Christianity. He said, "When religion has said its last word, there is little that we need other than God Himself. The evil habit of seeking God-and effectively prevents us from finding God in full revelation. In the 'and' lies our great woe. If we omit the 'and' we shall soon find God, and in Him we shall find that for which we have all our lives been longing for."

So, who sits on the throne of your heart? Is God sharing it with the 'ands' of your life - family, careers, social networks, human ideas/opinions, your pastor, denomination etc.? When a lawyer asked Jesus which of the 10 Commandments was the greatest, the Lord said to him, "Thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all your heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets" (Matthew 22:36-40).

I checked the meaning of the word "all" in three online dictionaries. Merriam-Webster says it refers to the "whole, entire, total, everything without exception." Cambridge Dictionary defines 'all' as "the complete number or amount, or the whole." Dictionary.com says 'all' denotes "wholly, entirely, completely, fully, utterly, totally, only, exclusively."

If we love the LORD with all our hearts, what is left for us to love our neighbours, children and parents with? The story of Ian McCormack, the man who died after he was attacked by five box jellyfish off the island of Mauritius aives us an idea about how we can love God exclusively and still love others. McCormack who met Jesus Christ in his Near Death Experience (NDE) has documented his experiences extensively online. A Movie, The Perfect Wave released in 2014, was based on his encounter with the jellyfish and with Christ.

After McCormack got married, he had another encounter with Jesus. This time, the Lord addressed the Scriptural demands that we should love God with 'all' our hearts. He explained to McCormack that the reason he was not able to meet this demand was that he (McCormack) had partitioned his heart to accommodate God and his wife. The Lord told him that the demand for believers to love God with all their hearts was not negotiable. He then explained to him that when he (McCormack) yields his entire heart to God, he will be so filled with God's love to overflowing, and that the overflow will touch everyone that encounters him, including his wife.

It was after listening to this aspect of his testimony in a video he posted on YouTube that I understood the import of Romans 5:5, "Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us." Someone once observed that God never asked us to do something that we can do in our own strength. This captures the essence of the Gospel. We are only able to please God through the instrumentality of the Holy Spirit; otherwise, Jesus Christ died in vain. We must remember that the New Covenant God spoke about in Jeremiah 31:31-34 was in response to the children of Israel not being able to keep the Old initiated under the Mosaic Law.



Romans 8 verses 3 and 4 explain the Gospel succinctly: "For what the law was powerless to do in that it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful man, as an offering for sin. He thus condemned sin in the flesh, so that the righteous standard of the law might be fulfilled in us, who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit." It is clear from the explanation contained in this Scripture that we cannot love God with all our hearts in our own strength.

Verse 8 of the cited chapter declares that those who live in the realm of flesh cannot please God. Who then can please God or love Him with the whole heart? The answer is found in Romans 8 verse 9, "But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." Verse 14 shuts the door against any argument on this matter, "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."

If you are finding it difficult to surrender your heart and your life to God, search yourself to ensure that you have received the Holy Spirit at conversion. John 1:12 declares "But as many as received Him (Christ), to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name." If Jesus has given you power to become a son of God, He would have also given you the Holy Spirit, because this is the seal of God's ownership of every believer (Ephesians 1:13). It is however, possible for you to receive the Holy Spirit at conversion and still be your own lord. God created us with a free will; hence, it is your prerogative to yield or not to yield to the leading of the Spirit. Otherwise, Paul would not have charged Galatian believers to "walk in the Spirit, and you will not gratify the cravings of the flesh" (Galatians 5:16).

Anyone who truly wants to love God with the totality of his or her being will yield to the leading of the Holy Spirit. There is no short cut to living in God's presence and letting Him sit on the throne of our hearts.



CHRISTIANITY IN EQUATORIAL GUINEA



The Republic of Equatorial Guinea is located in Central Africa. The country consists of a mainland territory, Rio Muni, bordered by Cameroon to the North and Gabon to the east and south, and five small islands – Bioko, Corisco, Annobon, Elobey Chico (Small Elobey), and Elobey Grande (Great Elobey. Bioko, the site of the capital, Malabo, lies about 40 kilometres off the coast of Cameroon. The official languages are Spanish, French and Portuguese. The country has human population of 1,795, 834 spread across many ethic groupings, including Fang, 85.7%; Bubi, 6.5%; Ndowe, 3.6%; Annobon, 1.6%; Bujeba, 1.1% and others 1.1%. The dominant faith is Roman Catholicism at 79.9%; Sunni Muslims, 4.1%; Independent Christians, 3.7%; Protestants, 3.2%; traditional beliefs, 2.1%; Atheism, 4.9% and other faiths, 2.1%.

Brief History

The country's history began with pre-colonial inhabitants like the Pygmies and Bantu people, followed by Portuguese exploration in 1472. Spain gained control of the territory in 1778, which became Spanish Guinea and unified into a single colony in 1926. After gaining independence in 1968, the nation endured the brutal dictatorship of Francisco Macias Nguema, who was overthrown in 1979 by his nephew, Teodoro Obiang Nguema Mbasogo. Obiang's rule has been marked by ongoing human rights concerns.

God's Canvass

Equatorial Guinea spans several ecoregions. Rio Muni region lies within the Atlantic Equatorial coastal forests ecoregion except for patches of Central African mangroves on the coast, especially the Muni River estuary. The Cross-Sanaga-Bioko coastal forests ecoregion covers most of Bioko and the adjacent portions of Cameroon and Nigeria on the African mainland. The fauna and flora of the country are presented below.

Fauna

The country is home to gorillas, chimpanzees, and various species of monkeys, as well as leopards, buffalo, antelope, elephants, hippopotamuses, crocodiles, and different types of snakes, including pythons. Some of the animals are shown below.















Flora

Equatorial Guinea's flora is characterised by dense tropical rainforests with over 140 species of trees, including commercially important ones like 'Okume,' as well as coastal mangroves and a rich variety of endemic species, particularly on Annobon Island. The pictures below capture some of the rich flora of the country.

Culture

■he country's culture is a mix of ancient indigenous traditions and European influences, particularly Spanish. Key aspects include vibrant music and dance with both traditional and Spanish-influenced styles, a blend of Roman Catholicism and animist beliefs, and a family-centric social structure. Fang people, who constitute the largest ethnic bloc, contribute more to the diverse language, food and art in the country.



The country's cuisine is a blend of indigenous traditions, Spanish colonial influences, and other Africa flavours. It is known for strong, spicy, and flavourful dishes. Key ingredients include fish, chicken, plantains, cassava, and a variety of vegetables, often prepared as hearty stews, soups, or grilled dishes. Some of the popular ones are shown below.









Status of Christianity in Equatorial Guinea

Roman Catholicism is the preferred faith of nearly 87% of the people of Equatorial Guinea. It has assumed the status of a state religion due to its overbearing influence on affairs of the country. While Christian groups also exist and operate schools, obtaining registration and other legal permits can be complicated for non-Catholic missions. It is worth noting that many who claim to be followers of Jesus Christ also practice some elements of indigenous religions, leading to a blend of faiths. This is particularly noticeable among Catholics. This sad situation has affected the propagation of the true Gospel in the country. There is no concord between Christ and Belial (2 Corinthians 6:15). Darkness and light cannot cohabit; neither can there be a compromise between death and life. Let us pray for God's light to destroy all forms of darkness in the country and set its people free from captivity.

Intercession Checklist

Use the political map of Equatorial Guinea provided in the text to pick a town, city or region for focused prayer. Present the chosen geographical space to the Father and tell Him that you are claiming unsaved souls there for Christ as His ambassador (2 Corinthians 5:20). Remind the Father that He had instructed the Messiah to ask for the entire earth as His inheritance (Psalm 2:8).

PRAYER POINTS

- 1. Pray that God would destroy all platforms and infrastructure of darkness in Equatorial Guinea, including those using His name to promote the work of satan.

PARENTS AS SPIRITUAL COVERING FOR THEIR CHILDREN



n the Kingdom of God, Jesus Christ is the only mediator between humans and the Father (1 Timothy 2:5). However, Scripture exhorts us to pray for one another, and to share each other's burdens. This is where the prayer of intercession finds it usefulness in the church. It calls for us standing in the gap for others; going before the Father to plead for His mercy on their behalf. In other for us to do this, we must have an unbroken relationship with God. Intercession is more critical in the home environment because we want to see our loved ones walking in the truth.

Therefore, godly parents are the best channels of such prayers, since no one can give another what they do not have. Acting as spiritual covering demands more than perfunctory and casual prayers that some people say just to assuage their conscience. Interceding for children must begin at their conception. Parents need to present them before the LORD and speak words of life over them before they are born. Pray for their health, education, careers, friendship, to guard against the influence of ungodly peers, marriage and other important aspects of human life. Parents should intensify their prayers as their children grow into toddlers, teenagers and adulthood.

Even when they marry and leave the home, parents must continue to cover their children in prayer without necessarily being nosey or prying into their private lives. God knows the need of each of His children. All the parents need to do is show care by reminding the Father of His promise to bless us and our children; and to be their Teacher (Isaiah 53:13).

These are the promises parents must claim for their children while presenting them to the LORD as their spiritual covering:

Isaiah 59:21, "As for Me, this is My covenant with them, says the LORD, My Spirit that is upon you, and

My words that I have put in your mouth, shall not depart out of your mouth, or out of the mouth of your offspring, or out of the mouth of your children's offspring' says the LORD, from this time forth and evermore;

- Psalm 102:28, "The children of Your servants ii. shall dwell secure; their offspring shall be established before You";
- Psalm 112:1-2, "Praise the LORD! Blessed is the man who fears the LORD, who greatly delights in His commandments! His offspring will be mighty in the land; the generation of the upright will be blessed";
- Isaiah 44:3-5, "For I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour My Spirit upon your offspring, and My blessing on your descendants. They shall spring up among the grass like willows by flowing streams. This one will say, 'I am the LORD's,' another will call on the name of Jacob, and another will write on his hand, 'The LORD's' and name himself by the name of Israel";
- Isaiah 61:8-9, "...I will make an everlasting covenant with them. Their offspring shall be known among the nations, and their descendants in the midst of the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge them, that they are an offspring the LORD has blessed";
- vi. Isaiah 65:23, "They shall not labour in vain or bear children for calamity, for they shall be the offspring of the blessed of the LORD, and their descendants with them";
- vii. Proverbs 20:7, "The righteous who walks in his integrity; His children are blessed after him";
- viii. Proverbs 14:26, "In the fear of the LORD one has strong influence, and his children will have a refuge";
- viii. Jeremiah 32:29, "I will give them one heart and one way, that they may fear Me forever, for their own good and the good of their children after them";

- Deuteronomy 4:40, "Therefore you shall keep His statutes and His commandments, which I command you today, that it may go well with you and with your children after you, and that you may prolong your days in the land that the LORD your God is giving you for the time"; and
- Acts 16:31-33, "And they said, 'Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household.' And they spoke the word of the LORD to him and to all who were in his house. And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their wounds; and he was baptised at once, he and all his family.

Mark Altrogge, pastor of Sovereign Grace Church, Indiana, USA emphasised the importance of parents acting as spiritual covering for their children until the day they (parents) leave this earth to be with the LORD. He stressed that even when parents do not see their children saved in their lifetime, God can still save them in His own time. Altrogge noted that although God does not guarantee that all our children with be saved; He promises to hear our prayers; that the prayer of the upright is powerful end effective. He also observed that God has given us good reasons to believe that He desires to save whole families.

As I type this article, tears welled up in my eyes for the opportunities my parents missed to pray for my siblings and me. If they had done what we advised in this article, I would not be going through the horrors and pains inflicted on me by satan and his demons due to polluted bloodlines of my forebears. While these battles have increased my understanding of spiritual things, especially the hideousness of the devil, I wish with all my heart that my parents had done the needful in their lifetime. So, if you are reading this article as a parent, pray earnestly for your children using the Scriptures provided as a guide. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you more if you so desire. You are the caretakers of your children. Don't let them down by your carelessness.



is name is synonymous with rebellion against God and oppression of the helpless. R.C. Sproul, an American theologian said of him, "All God had to do to harden Pharaoh's heart or to harden your heart, is to withhold His grace." Michael Hart, an American author referenced him in one of his books and said, "Revolution does have to be violent precisely because the Pharaoh would not let you go. If the Pharaoh would let you go, the revolution won't have to be violent." On his part, Carl Sagan, an American astronomer said, "Nearly everyone in ancient Egypt exhorted the gods to let the Pharaoh live 'forever.' These collective prayers failed. Their failure constitutes data." Our guest for today is the Pharaoh who ruled Egypt when God freed the children of Israel from their 400 years of bondage.

Shepherd Heart:

Shepherd Heart:

Your plans for them smacked of evil cooked up in the pit of hell. What happened to mercy? Did you not have even an ounce of compassion for a people that contributed to the growth and development of your country, especially under the reign of Joseph?

Pharaoh:

(Laughs) You are being ridiculously sentimental and ignorant of the workings of ancient regimes. In my time, humans did not have nor enjoy fundamental rights. Shepherd Heart:

It was then he had an uncanny urge to contact Finn Huber, a pastor he'd barely exchanged pleasantries with since he joined the ministry. He'd tried to rationalize his aversion to the tall and handsome pastor to no avail.
