MARTYRDOM OF BISHOP NICHOLAS RILEY (1555)

r Ridley was born in Northumberland, aland in 1550. He obtained his basic education at Newcastle before proceeding to Cambridge University. He was head of Pembroke College, from where he obtained the prestigious Doctor of Divinity. He spent some months in Paris, and upon his return to England, King Henry VIII appointed him his Chaplain. The King later promoted him to the bishopric of Rochester. From there, King Edward VI made him the Bishop of London.

People flocked to the church to listen to Ridley's sermons, swarming about him like bees to honey. He not only preached wholesome doctrine, he demonstrated it with his life. He was a bright light to the blind,



a heavenly trumpet to the deaf, and a holy voice to lost sinners. He lived and ministered in such purity that not even his enemies could reprove him in any jot or tittle. Ridley was intelligent, wise, and artful in dealing with others. He was such a good, godly, and spiritual man that England may rightly mourn the day that such a treasure was lost.

Each morning, Ridley devoted himself to private prayer until ten o'clock, and then took part in the daily prayers that were held in his house by members of his parish. After a midday dinner, he would talk to others or play chess for an hour, and then spend the rest of the afternoon studying or taking care of church business. About five o'clock, he would pray for about an hour again, refresh himself at chess for another hour, then return to his study until eleven o'clock, when he would retire after praying on his knees for a while.

About September 8, 1552, in his capacity as Bishop of London, Ridley went early in the morning to visit Lady Mary, who later became Queen Mary I, at Hunsdon where she was staying. There, he was entertained by Sir Thomas Wharton and other officials in Mary's court until almost eleven o'clock when Lady Mary received him with all courtesy. When they held a private discussion on the issue of faith, she made it clear to him that she was not interested in hearing about his Protestant faith and its reformation. She concluded their discussion by saying, "My lord, for your consideration in coming to see me, I thank you. But for your offering to preach before me, I don't thank you the least bit."

In the meantime, Bishop Ridley and several others were imprisoned in the Tower of London. These included Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury and Hugh Latimer, former Bishop of Worcester.

On March 10, 1554, these men were taken from the Tower to Oxford University to debate with the Queen's chosen doctors of divinity about the following articles of faith:

- Whether the natural body of Christ is really in the sacrament after the words spoken by Roman Cathi. olic priests;
- ii. Whether after the words of consecration any other substance remains in the sacrament other than the body and blood of Christ; and
- iii. Whether in the Catholic mass there is a propitiatory sacrifice for the sins of the living and the dead.

After hearing these read, Ridley said without delay that the Catholic doctrines on which these questions hung, were all false. He said he would defend the truth as long as God gave him life. He later submitted his report at the behest of the papal inquisitors, in which he condemned the false doctrines of Roman Catholic Church. After this, he was separated from Crammer and Latimer, and kept in custody of a man named Irish, where he remained until the day of his execution on October 16, 1555.

The night before his execution, Ridley said to Mrs Irish, the keeper's wife who served him breakfast, "Though my breakfast in the morning will be somewhat sharp and painful, yet I am sure my supper in the evening will be most pleasant and sweet." Before his execution, he knelt next to the stake and kissed it and prayed for strength. After one Dr Smith preached a short sermon, urging him to recant, Ridley said,

So long as there is breath in my body, I will never deny the Lord Christ and His known truth. God's will be done in me." Then he held up his hands and said, "O heavenly Father, I give unto Thee most hearty thanks, for that Thou has called me to profess Thee, even unto death. I beseech Thee, Lord God, have mercy upon this land of England and deliver her from all her enemies." When the faggots placed around him were lit with fire, he cried with a loud voice, "Lord, Lord, receive my spirit!

Hundreds of onlookers were moved to tears by what they had witnessed. Though the world did not give Ridley any reward for the work he did, and the many souls he touched with the love of God, he was warmly received by the One he served with his whole heart. The Roman Catholic Church may have silenced this godly servant of God, but his legacy lives on in the millions of people that have received the truth preserved by the testimony he affirmed with his blood.


WHO IS LORD OF YOUR LIFE?




any people have different ideas about Christianity. To some, it is the pathway to wealth and happiness. To others, is it a social network allowing them to mingle with people of like minds. Another group sees the faith as an escape from hell; while others view it as an opportunity to assuage their conscience and find favour with God.

There is a central theme that cuts across the Old and New Covenants – God's redemption plan, articulated in the Old Testament but fulfilled under the New Covenant. What was the relationship between Adam and God in the Garden of Eden before the fall engineered by satan? God created humanity to be dependent on Him. Just as a fish is dead when it stays out of water, humans cannot survive outside their Creator. That was why eating the fruit from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (independence from God) meant certain death. Revelation 4:11 says that the Father created all things to give Him pleasure. This includes all humans.

Jesus Christ said in John 8:29, "And He that sent Me is with Me: the Father hath not left Me alone; for I do always those things that please Him." In essence, only obedience brings God pleasure. 
said, "The LORD Almighty is the one you are to regard as holy, He is the one you are to fear, He is the one you are to dread" (Isaiah 8:13).

CHRISTIANITY IN ERITREA



he State of Eritrea is located in the Horn of Africa region of East Africa. It shares border with Ethiopia to the South, Sudan to the West, and Djibouti to the Southeast. The Northeastern and Eastern parts of the country have extensive coastline along the Red Sea. Eritrea's capital and largest city is Asmara. There is no official language, as the country's 1997 Constitution guarantees equality of all Eritrean languages. However, Tigrinya and Arabic are the main working languages, while English is used for secondary and university education and in various technical fields. The country has a human population of about 6,400,000, spread across several ethnic groupings. These are, Tigrinya, 50%; Tigre, 30%; Saho, 4%; Afar, 4%; Kunama, 4%; Bilen, 3%; Beja, 2%; Nara, 2%; and Rashaida, 1%. The two main religions in Eritrea are Christianity (63%) and Islam (37%).

Brief History

Eritrea was a province of Ethiopia for several decades. Militant opposition to the incorporation of Eritrea into Ethiopia started in 1958 with the founding of Eritrean Liberation Movement (ELM). The group, under the leadership of Hamid Idris Awate, engaged in clandestine

political activities intended to cultivate resistance to the centralizing policies of the imperial Ethiopian state. By 1962, however, the ELM was dismantled the Ethiopian authorities. Same year, Emperor Haile Selassie unilaterally dissolved the Eritrean parliament and illegally annexed

the enclave. This triggered armed conflict, which continued until the Emperor was ousted in a military coup in 1974. The Derg, the new Ethiopian government, was a Marxist military junta led by Mengistu Haile Mariam.

n 1960, Eritrean exiles in Cairo founded the Eritrean Liberation Front (ELF), which led the Eritrean independence struggle, with the support of Syria and Iraq. It is noteworthy that was led by Muslims. The group initiated military operations in 1961 against the Ethiopian government, and this escalated into civil unrest that saw the massacre of many Eritreans by the Ethiopian government in Ethiopia. Respite came in 1974 when Mengistu-led Marxists ousted the Emperor.

In 1972, a more inclusive group, Eritrean People's Liberation Front (ELPF) emerged under the leadership of Isaias Afewerki, current President of Eritrea. It succeeded in galvanising support for its cause from many fronts, including Ethiopian rebels. Though Eritrea declared its independence in 1991, the United Nations officially endorsed this in 1993. Tensions between the two countries dominated the first decades after independence, sometimes in the form of armed conflict.

God's Canvass

Eritrea has three ecoregions: a hot arid coastal plain in the West that widens toward the East, the cooler, more fertile highlands reaching up to 3,000 metres, and the Sahelian Acacia Savanah in the Western part of the country, which extends across Africa south of the Sahara from Eritrea to Senegal. These ecoregions determine the nature of flora and fauna found in the country.

A variety of trees like acacia, baobabs, and doum palms are native to Eritrea, along with shrubs, grasses and aloe camperi. Other notable plants include the national flower, the Gerbera daisy, and economically valuable plants like Sisal and Salicornia. Culture

■ritrean culture is a diverse mix of nine ethnic groups, unified by a shared history and strong national identity. Key elements include a deep sense of patriotism, a dual religious landscape of Christianity and Islam that coexists peacefully, and traditions like the communal coffee ceremony. Food like 'Injera' with stews is central to social gatherings, and extended family is a cornerstone of community life.



Both male and female clothing can be very colourful and elaborate for special events. The traditional wear for men consists of the 'Ethiopian suit,' a long-sleeved shirt and matching pants, or a draped cloth wrap called an 'izar.' For women, the traditional attire includes the ankle-length 'Habesha kemis (or zuria), a dress often











Cuisine

Eritrean cuisine is a blend of stews (tsebhi/wat) served with injera (a sour, spongy flatbread) often-featuring spiced meats like beef, chicken or lamb. It shares similarities with Ethiopian food but has unique Italian influences, such as pasta dishes, due to Eritrean colonial history. Some of them are shown in the pictures below.

Status of Christianity

While the majority of the country's Christian population belong to the orthodox faith, roughly 10% of these identify with Roman Catholicism, which was favoured by Italian overlords. In 2002, the President, Isaias Afewerki declared all independent Protestant churches enemies of the state. In subsequent years, Eritrea became notorious for jailing thousands of persecuted Christians in metal containers parked in the jungle, where they would boil by day, and freeze by night. Currently, there are between 400 and 1000 prisoners of faith in the country. The government also makes it impossible for independent churches to establish their presence by denying them registration. It only recognises the Eritrean Orthodox Church (EOC), Roman Catholic, Lutheran Church and Islam.

Obviously, believers in the country are not enjoying the freedom for which Christ has set us free (Galatians 5:1). Wherever the government exercises authority to dictate the faith of its subject, the spirit at work is from satan's kingdom. God created humans with a free will and does not infringe on it even though He has the power to do so. Therefore, let us intercede not just for the persecuted believers in Eritrea, but also for unsaved souls using the prayer points below or as the Holy Spirit leads us.

Intercession Checklist

From the political map of the country presented in the text, choose a town, city or region for focused prayer. Present the selected geographical space to God and tell Him that you are claiming its people for Christ as His ambassador (2 Corinthians 5:20). Remind the Father that He had instructed the Messiah to ask for the nations as His inheritance (Psalm 2:8).

PRAYER POINTS

- 1. Pray that the Father would judge the demonic principalities and powers using the government to undermine the propagation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 2. Ask Him to destroy their influence in government and uproot whatever seed they have planted in the country through obnoxious policies and laws.
- 3. Pray that God would destroy every platform and infrastructure serving the purposes of the kingdom of darkness in the country, especially those in the religious spheres.
- 4. Pray that He would remove the covering cast of darkness from the heart, eyes and minds of the President, his cabinet and other unsaved souls in the country, to enable them receive and embrace the true Gospel.
- 5. Ask the Father to destroy all faulty foundations laid in the lives of Christians through errors and demonic doctrines.
- 6. Pray that He would lay new foundation in them that is in Christ Jesus His Son.
- 7. Ask the Father to reveal Himself to Eritreans who doubt His existence.
- 8. Pray that He would expose the pollutions in Christendom and sanctify all believers with His word, which is the only TRUTH.
- 9. Ask God to open doors in Muslim and animist dominated areas for the Gospel of the Kingdom to be preached without hindrance.
- 10. Pray that He would protect missionaries operating in such areas from attacks by Islamic militants.

PARENTS AS SPIRITUAL GUARDIANS



fter God created Adam and Eve, He charged them to multiply and fill the earth (Genesis 1:28). In essence, the primary function of humans is to reproduce their kind. God initiated marriage for this purpose. While Scripture is silent on what transpired between Him and the first couple on the best way to raise their offspring, we see His desire expressed in Genesis 18:19 in His relationship with Abraham. 



The cited Scripture is clear that God expects us to do something to pave way for the fulfilment of His promises to us. That singular thing is obedience. There is no way a righteous God will reward our disobedience by stepping out of character to bless our rebellion. Therefore, parents who fail to raise their children in the fear and nurture of the LORD (Ephesians 6:4), have failed in their most important assignment. In the New Testament, such people are disqualified from holding important offices in the church (1 Timothy 3:5).

Parents act as spiritual guardians by guiding their children's moral and faith development through modelling, teaching, and nurturing spiritual growth from a young age. The role involves instilling values, leading in prayer, discussing spiritual truths, and creating supportive atmosphere for faith to flourish. This responsibility is a cornerstone of many religious traditions, which view parents as stewards for the spiritual well-being of their children.



Key Aspects of Parental Spiritual Guardianship

- Modelling faith: Living out one's own values and beliefs is one of the most powerful ways to influence a child's spiritual life.
- Teaching and discipleship: This involves teaching Scripture, explaining beliefs, and guiding children in prayer and wise decision-making in all areas of life.
- iii. Nurturing spiritual growth: This means planting seeds of spiritual growth by actively engaging with a child's faith journey, rather than just providing religious instruction.
- **Leading the home:** Parents are called to be the primary spiritual leaders within the home, establishing a moral atmosphere and helping their children to navigate life's challenges from a spiritual perspective.

- Encouraging a relationship with God: This can involve praying together, attending Christian fellowship, and encouraging a personal, heartfelt connection to the LORD.
- Building a foundation: By modelling and teaching, parents build a solid foundation for their children's faith that will serve them long after they leave home.

HEALTH BENEFITS OF SLEEP





HOW TO GET A GOOD NIGHT'S SLEEP



TIPS TO SLEEP BETTER



Go to bed and get up at the same time every day.



Maintain an appropriate sleeping environment: dark, relaxing, not too hot nor cold.



Avoid caffeine (tea, coffee, etc.) and nicotine (cigarettes, etc.) for at least 4 hours before going to bed. These are stimulants.



Avoid using smartphones or watching TV just before bedtime. The bright light from screens inhibits the secretion of melatonin which is needed to fall asleep.



Avoid alcohol for at least 4 hours before going to bed. It affects sleep quality.



A hot bath an hour or two before bedtime helps.



Do not use your bed for watching TV, eating, reading or working on the laptop or phone.



Sleep rituals like relaxing stretches or breathing exercises before going to bed could help some people.



Eating right is important. Going to bed on a very empty stomach or immediately after a heavy meal can backfire.



Regular exercise is helpful for a good sleep but strenuous exercise before bedtime can disrupt sleep.





INTERVIEW WITH OLD TESTAMENT FIGURES -HANNAH



ur guest for this edition of the interview series epitomises resilience in adversity. She also models for us, the art of prevailing prayer. She is none other than Hannah, the wife of Elkanah and mother of Samuel the prophet.

Shepherd Heart:

We are glad to have you with us dear Hannah.

Hannah:

Thank you for giving me an opportunity to share my story with your readers.

Shepherd Heart:

Kindly give us a pen portrait of yourself.

Hannah:

I was one of the two wives of Elkanah, an Ephramite from Ramathaim Zuphim, in the hill country of Ephraim. My husband's father was Jehoram, the son of Zuph of the lineage of Tolu.

Shepherd Heart:

What was your daily life like as a wife?

Hannah:

It was not stressful because my husband showed me much love. Of course, I was engaged in farming like most ancient Israelites. It was not a challenging occupation though. I also kept some domestic animals, mostly for food.

Shepherd Heart:

At what point did you realise that you were barren?

Hannah:

It was not something that stole up on you. When you are married for three to four years and have no child, you start to worry. I did that for a long time.

Shepherd Heart:

Scripture says that your rival, Peninnah provoked you unceasingly over your plight, causing you to fret. Would you have

prayed so earnestly to the LORD for a child if she had been sympathetic to your plight?

Hannah:

(Laughs) Of course not! I believe that the devil used her to push me into my destiny. What the wicked satan meant for evil, God turned it into good as always. When she started mocking me, I was actually very angry. I had to restrain myself several times from getting physical with her. It was God's grace that kept me from crossing the line into violence or saying something nasty to her.

Shepherd Heart:

What was the turning point? Why did you decide to take the matter to God?

Hannah:

The prayer at Shiloh was just a culmination of my daily supplications. I prayed and cried myself to sleep many nights before that day at Shiloh.

Shepherd Heart:

What was it Eli the priest said that made you believe that God has answered your prayer?

Hannah:

It was not merely, what the priest said. I knew right within my heart that my petition had received a favourable response from God. The burden of bareness was lifted from my shoulders.

Shepherd Heart:

Bareness is also a very serious issue in our time. Many Christian women have ship-wreaked their faith by turning to native doctors and the occult in search of children. In Africa, many tribes treat barren women as sub-humans. What advice would you give to those experiencing delayed pregnancy or bareness?

Hannah:

Psalms 127:3 says that "Children are an heritage from the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is His reward." I do not want to argue with the LORD and His word by asking how this would have applied to Peninnah and not to me. We must accept God's word and trust Him to work out His purposes in our lives. When He gave me Samuel and blessed me with five more children, I came to realise that even Peninnah was not an enemy. She was God's instrument to bring forth a Samuel. He was no ordinary child as everyone came to find out.

So, my advice to anyone having difficulty conceiving a child is to seek God's face in earnest. No child is from the devil as God is the only source of life. The problem with most women is that they just resign themselves to fate, believing satan's lies that God meant them to be barren. In Exodus 23:6, God gave a sure promise to ancient Israel that "No woman in your land will miscarry or be barren." Has He changed His mind? Certainly not! Anyone who has this kind of challenge should remind God of His promise and trust Him to fulfil it in due course.

Shepherd Heart:

Thank you for your wise counsel. We pray that our readers, especially the women folks will take it to heart. God remains faithful to His word always, through to eternity.

As he walked out of Bishop's Hegel's office, Pastor Paul Khan hummed a tune to himself. He knew he had to keep his emotion in check. This time, he resolved not to share his encounter with any of the pastors. He walked briskly to his office and picked up his car key. Thankfully, none of his associates was around as he drove out of the premises. He was not surprised about the conduct of Oscan. Almost everyone in the ministry knew he was Hegel's lackey. What angered him was the fact that he could stoop so low to lie against a fellow pastor apparently to curry favour with Hegel.

On getting to Waiblingen by-pass, he turned into a side road and parked the car. He brought out his address book and thumbed through the pages until he found particulars of the editor of the Stars and Stripes newspaper, Heinz Chapman. He first met the journalist at a parents/teachers

association meeting. They chatted briefly before exchanging telephone numbers. He dialled Chapman's number and was surprised by the warmth with which he was received by the journalist. They agreed to meet at his office located on Nurnberg Road by 3:30p.m.

That done, he drove to the regional office of Deutsche Welle TV on Schmaltz Avenue to solicit the assistance of his friend, Ortiz Zimmermann, its Director. Both of them graduated from Laude High School before they gained admission into separate universities. While waiting in the plush visitor's room of his friend, Khan pondered on the vicissitudes of life. He couldn't understand why everything Bishop Hegel touched turned to gold despite his obvious shortcomings as a Christian leader.

Here was a man that had flouted virtually all instructions Jesus gave to his Disciples and yet God allowed him to preside over the largest congregation of Pentecostals in Stuttgart! He smiled when he remembered a remark made by a young man sitting in the same coach with him in an express train during his students' days at Humboldt University, Berlin

That morning, he left the campus with a heavy heart because his close friend, Peter Osuaze, an African student had been withdrawn by the university authorities for his inability to pay his school fees. He, of course was not in a position to help his friend as his father's stipends from the church barely sustained his family of five. Still trying to escape from the pain in his heart over his friend's fate, he buried his head in a

novel he picked for the two hours ride. He was not in the mood to listen to the chatter of other passengers. The rancorous laughter of the young man brought him out of his world. Then he heard the man say something quite profound, "Is there justice in the world? Sometimes, I wonder if there is any unbiased umpire watching over us. I want to believe there is a being in control of our destinies but some occurrences in life make me wonder if such a faith is misplaced."

Khan looked at the young man and a pair of blue eyes smiled at him. He grinned and returned to his novel. All through the journey, he could not dismiss the comment from his mind. It haunted him even after he graduated from the university and proceeded to the Bible School run by Hegel and his team of pastors. He constantly barraged God with questions along this line but got no satisfying answer. One day, he was led to read Romans chapter nine. What he gleaned from that Scripture was the fact that Paul the Apostle also wrestled with the imponderables of life and resolved to let God be GOD! "..... Who are you a mere human being to criticize God? Should the thing that was created say to the one who made it, "Why have you made me like this?" (Romans 9:20).

A tap on his shoulder by Zimmermann's secretary brought him out of his reverie. She beckoned on him to follow her as she ushered him into her boss' office. His host, a thick set man in his early forties rose to his feet from his ornate table and stretched out his hand in a warm welcome. He smiled broadly and said, "Today must be

my day to enjoy special blessing, Pastor. It is not everyday people in our profession rub shoulders with holy men of God." Both men roared with laughter and embraced before they moved to Zimmermann's lounge.

After their refreshment, Khan brought out a piece of paper from his pocket and spread it on the table for his host to see. He said,

Zimmermann looked at his quest and cleared his throat. He had been waiting for the

opportunity to bare his mind on certain happenings in the church. He felt Khan's visit was the right moment. He cleared his throat again and said, "Khan, you and I have weathered many storms in our respective professions. I admire you for choosing to give God your all. It could not have been easy for you to chuck up everything for the sake of the gospel. I know you used to have this thing for architecture when we were

> in college. Nevertheless, I want you to know that I am always here for you.

Pardon me if I am a little brash this morning old boy. I do not seem to understand the thrust of the message coming from your church. My concern has nothing to do with the fact that I'm a Baptist. Let me tell you a story related to me by

a Catholic friend. Last Christmas, his church mobilized interested members to visit leprosy

colonies in Sierra Leone and Gambia, both in Africa. The participants spent their Christmas and New Year holidays with these wretched of the earth. The beauty of it all was that no media house was informed of the enterprise. Think about it Paul. What would Jesus have done if he had the kind of resources at the disposal of your ministry and he felt like blessing orphanages in Stuttgart? Would he have invited Etos and Deutsche Welle television stations to cover the event?"

Khan caught and held his friend's gaze for more than two minutes before he said quietly, "My sentiments really. You have not hurt me at all Ortiz. You cannot even begin to understand the private hell I am going through in my church. I could walk away but that will cost me the pleasure of One I hold dear, Jesus Christ.

It may interest you to note that your concerns are shared by many people in my church. The snag is, where do you run to for succour? Where in Christendom has the gospel of gain not taken root?

hen I drove out this morning, I was so disoriented that I felt like getting out of Stuttgart just for respite. Can you imagine my Bishop inviting a comedian to minister to the saint of God? Well, some people may justify this by the fact that the jokes are centre around happenings in the church. Where did we imbibe this spirit of entertainment? Who imparted it to us? Is it the same Holy Spirit who through Paul forbade foolish talks and coarse jokes among Christians?

We are to be Disciples of Christ. Was there ever a time he hired comedians or used jokes to get his message across? I also think undue publicity being given Christian philanthropy is in bad taste. This is particularly irksome among Western This is particularly irksome among

Western missionaries and agencies operating in Africa. Should they dehumanize impoverished African people just because they want to elicit sympathy for their programs? Ortiz, every right thinking Christian should condemn this theatre of the absurd. It is not the gospel of Jesus Christ. I do not think it is enough for you to sit on the fence and only speak out when it is convenient for you so that you would not be seen as rocking the boat."

Zimmermann sat with head bowed. Khan's rebuke hit home and he could not but acknowledge that he had failed Christ by failing to deploy resources at his disposal to fight against the rot in the church. He was not blind to the antics of some ministers that propagate what Khan described as a strange gospel.

He felt it was not his duty to speak out, after all, he was not a graduate of any Bible School. He had only commented on the happenings in Khan's church because he felt his friend needed to be told the truth.

Zimmermann smiled as he recalled a sermon preached by his pastor, Edwin Kluxman on the day his first daughter was confirmed. He had been uneasy when the man looked pointedly at him and said,

Some people believe they are too good to work for God. That is a silly notion because God always desires the best hands in his vineyard. That includes everyone redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ. We are all called to serve wherever we find ourselves. There is nothing secular about the life of a Christian. Everything we do brings honour to God if offered to him in love.
